Lindhurst High School Presentation to the Board of Trustees 10/22/13

The first days of the 2013-2014 school year have been charged with energy, focus, and a new optimism that the students of Lindhurst High School can and will succeed both socially and academically. Blazer ignition is Lindhurst's program to welcome and acclimate incoming freshman during freshman orientation during the summer. This was spearheaded by our Associated Student Body. This year's ASB hit the ground running in the middle of summer with their summer retreat. They have brought new ideas and enthusiasm to LHS. We had our first outside dance which saw huge success and attendance for our first home football game. It was a powerful and encouraging beginning for our new school year. We have made all the nessessary preparations for an exciting homecoming week which includes the revival of an old tradition of a bon fire. Student, community, and alumni buzz is very positive about this event.

Traditionally, one of the major challenges of starting a new school year is the implementation of the master schedule. Typically, students will find themselves on the first day of school with incomplete or unworkable schedules. Often these difficulties can take upward of three weeks to correct. This year, we are pleased to say that 100% of our students were placed on the first day of school with the exception of new enrollees. The only adjustments necessary were for the purpose of balancing class size and those changes were largely complete within the first week of school. This translates into less disruption of student's learning and less frustration for both teachers and students who are able to dive straight into their classes without stops and restarts.

Academically, we are off to a good start. We have received our 10th grade CAHSEE scores; 73% pass rate in math and 68% pass rate in English Language Arts. This is a slight drop from the previous year. Areas that we still have a significant educational gap are with our English Learner subgroup and most notably our special education subgroup. We have restructured our classes for those students who have been identified as English Learners for more than seven years providing them a more direct intensive curriculum to help break the cycle of what some call, "terminally EL." With our special education subgroup, we have moved those students who show near grade level acquisition in English from intervention courses to supported core English courses and are closely monitoring their progress. In addition, we offer a study skills and support class. This is designed to provide extra help and instruction in those core areas of need. Additionally, we are preparing for the shift to common core. While this is a major undertaking, teachers are very positive about the end results...have students measured by what they can do. This is more aligned to what the students will be expected to be able to do in the real world. A shift this large will have its challenges but our teachers are eager and working very well together for the smoothest and most effective transition possible.

Lindhurst continues to offer a variety of Advanced Placement courses for students who need extra academic rigor and challenge. These courses help push those students, who are ready, for the demands of college level courses. In addition, successful scores on the end of course Advanced Placement exam can lead our students to receiving college credit for the corresponding course. Lindhurst High school also provides support and intervention courses that are structured to accelerate the ascension of underperforming students to grade level skills. These courses are embedding into our English Language Learner program as well as our general education algebra courses and Special Education program. We feel that with these efforts we will continue to move forward and out of the designation of Program Improvement. More importantly, we are targeting the needs of the individual students with the anticipated result being that our graduates will be fully prepared for college, trade school, or work when they leave Lindhurst.

This is an Agreement between Partner, Marysville Joint Unified School District, participating as a Partner organization with the Center for Nutrition and Activity Promotion (CNAP) in the provision of nutrition education and obesity prevention services to participating school children, and The CSU, Chico Research Foundation (Foundation), acting as lead agency for CNAP.

I. Background:

The California Departments of Public Health and Social Services, through the Network for a Healthy California (Network) have awarded U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) funds to the Yuba County Department of Health and Human Services, and Yuba County has awarded a Contract to Foundation for CNAP's Nutrition Education and Physical Activity Program (the Program). The term of Foundation's Contract from Yuba County is October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014.

II. Purpose & Scope

The purpose of this Agreement is to clearly identify the roles and responsibilities of Partner and Foundation as they relate to the CNAP collaboration and partnership around the promotion of health and nutrition in SNAP-education eligible populations. In particular, this Agreement is intended to implement the Program as detailed in the scope of work of Yuba County's Applications to Network for USDA SNAP funds

III. Partner's Responsibilities:

Partner shall participate in the Program for the duration of this Agreement's Term by contributing nutrition education services and materials and by providing Program information to Foundation on behalf of CNAP. Partner shall:

- 1. Provide a supportive working environment for CNAP staff (e.g., nutrition/health education specialist and/or a community nutrition/health assistant);
- 2. Support and implement appropriate and/or required Program activities/events and policies based on the Program scope of work approved by Network including provision of required evaluation information, as appropriate, to assess program effectiveness.
- 3. Facilitate attendance at Program meetings and trainings with CNAP by Partner's coordinator for the Program and other appropriate personnel of Partner, as schedules permit;
- 4. Provide to Foundation verification that Program participants meet USDA low-income criteria (e.g., for school districts and other education agencies, targeting low-resource schools, defined as those with 50% of students or more eligible for free or reduced-price school meals);

IV. Foundation's Responsibilities:

Foundation, as lead agency for CNAP, shall provide the following for the duration of this Agreement's Term:

- 1. The services of CNAP staff (e.g., nutrition/health education specialist, community nutrition/health assistant, CNAP Program Manager, CNAP Administrative Assistant);
- 2. Fingerprint based criminal information background checks (Live Scan) for all CNAP staff who will have supervisory or disciplinary power over a minor or any person under said staff member's care as allowed under California Penal Code section 11105.3.:
- 3. Report writing, budget monitoring, documentation gathering, grant fund management, and audit responsibility as required by USDA and Network;
- 4. Assurance that Program activities comply with requirements of USDA and Network;
- 5. Provision of Program information and related materials to Program participants;
- 6. Guidelines and procedures for requesting purchases to be made by CNAP;
- 7. Purchase of Program materials (e.g., nutrition education materials, etc.) for Partner;
- 8. Monthly CNAP informational/training meetings;
- 9. Reimbursement to Partner for actual costs of travel incurred during the Project Period as necessary for attendance at meetings or trainings with CNAP, at CNAP or Network sponsored events, or (with CNAP's prior written approval) to other conferences or trainings directly benefiting the Program (all not to exceed Partner's share of the budget for travel in Yuba County's application

approved by Network, and at reimbursement rates not exceeding those set by the California Department of Human Resources, and not including any portion of costs allocable to non-Program activity).

V. It is mutually understood and agreed to by Foundation and Partner that:

- 1. Modification of this Agreement must be made in writing and must be agreed to and executed by the parties before becoming effective.
- 2. Either party to this Agreement may elect to terminate this Agreement, but only upon 30 days advance written notice of such election to the other party, and the parties will deal with each other in good faith in the event of such termination.
- 3. This Agreement is provisional, pending award and appropriation and encumbrance of funds for the Program as described in Yuba County's Application for the period of this Agreement's Term.
- 4. Each party to this Agreement shall defend, indemnify and hold the other party and its respective directors, officers, employees, agents, successors and assigns free and harmless of and from any and all demands, claims, causes of action, actions, liability, injuries including death, damages, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred by reason of or in any way connected with the acts or omissions of the party or of its directors, officers, employees or agents occurring during the course and term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter.
- 5. Each party to this Agreement shall follow all relevant and applicable regulations as specified in Yuba County's award from Network. These may include, but are not limited to:
 - A. Travel and Per Diem Reimbursement Partner will not request reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses at rates exceeding those established by the California Department of Human Resources;
 - B. Subcontract Agreements as it relates to securing bids for subcontractor services and subcontractor approval;
 - C. Lobbying Restrictions No federally appropriated funds may be used to pay any person influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, member of Congress, or employee of a member of Congress in connection with specific federal actions.

VI. Funding Requirements:

- 1. This Agreement does not include the reimbursement of funds between the two parties, except for reimbursement by Foundation of Partner's travel costs as described above.
- VII. Record Retention:

Foundation and Partner must maintain all records supporting this Agreement and related activities for three years after the end of the term of Yuba County's award from Network. Additionally, Partner agrees to make all records relating to this Agreement available upon request by Foundation on behalf of CNAP, the Network, and/or USDA.

VIII. Effective Date and Signature:

This Agreement shall be effective upon the signature of Partner and Foundation authorized officials. It shall be in force for the Agreement Term specified above. Foundation and Partner indicate agreement with the foregoing by their signatures below.
