Presentation to the Board of Trustees 12/10/13

Edgewater Elementary opened in August 2009 with 263 students serving grades K-3. Currently, we have 490 students in grades k-6. Each fall, students, staff, and community members are welcomed before school starts with root beer floats provided and served by the Linda Lion's Club.

Parent and community involvement at Edgewater continues to thrive. Our current and past PTO officers are frequently on campus and help our school in a variety of ways volunteering in classrooms, organizing student activities, and planning future events. They are an excellent group of problem solvers and enjoy assisting teachers and searching for solutions and opportunities to improve Edgewater Elementary.

Our secretary, Elementary Student Support Specialist, and one of our para-educators are bilingual providing necessary communication with our Spanish speaking population. We rely heavily on our Messenger phone calling system to communicate with parents and provide the messages in Spanish for our Spanish speaking families. A schoolwide newsletter is sent home monthly in addition to any notifications of special events. Our PTO maintains a Facebook page with school information providing another avenue of communication to our families.

STARS continues to provide a highly desired after-school care program for our students. We currently have a waiting list due to high demand for the program. Based on requests from parents, we continue to offer an early morning drop off time. Supervision for the morning program is provided by donations from parents.

One of the challenges we face for the first time this year, although it is common at other schools in our district, is a continuous change in our enrollment. We have had families moving out frequently, and continue to have others enrolling.

Our Academic Performance Index (API) declined last year from 802 to 796. We increased our API in the English Learners subgroup by 8 points and our Socioeconomically Disadvantaged by 10 points. Our White population scores decreased by 7 points and our Hispanic or Latino by 8 points. Most grade levels maintained or increased their levels of proficiency while one grade level went down. Teachers analyzed the student score data, curriculum and interventions, and made adjustments to instruction and intervention to continue to improve student academic performance. Teachers review student data with their grade levels throughout the year and monitor and adjust their instruction. Interventions are provided for students that are not at a proficient level, and we continue to look at ways to provide curriculum to students performing above their grade level. Read Naturally, Waterford and Accelerated Reader, Brain Pop, IXL (computer based math program) are a few of the supplemental programs successfully implemented at Edgewater. In addition, we currently have 80 Ipads for student use in the classroom and an additional six in our library. Classrooms use them throughout the day for instruction, intervention, and enrichment in addition to the six PC computers in each classroom. We currently have three para-educators assisting teachers in addition to two para-educators that assist students in our special education program with our RSP teacher.

Last year, we celebrated reclassifiying 23 of our EL students based on their CST and CELDT scores in addition to their current classroom performance and report card grades. Teachers continue to focus on increasing student proficiency in English and provide additional instruction during intervention and workshop times.

Transitioning to Common Core Standards has become one of our primary goals this year. Teachers are learning the standards, adjusting curriculum, increasing the use of student technology, and actively involved in professional development opportunities. Teachers are meeting with their grade levels and developing resources and materials to help their students transition to proficiency in Common Core Standards. The teachers at Edgewater are experienced, dedicated, and strive to maintain a positive work environment especially throughout the changes and challenges we face. Everyone works together to assist any staff member and students.

Additional shelves were added this summer to our library. The library is open many days after school, and families take advantage of this time. Our literacy resource technician also coordinates our Accelerated Reader program which documented students reading over 27,000 books and over 111,370,475 words. This is a new record for Edgewater topping last year's books read by over 6,000. Additionally, we had students in first grade and kindergarten participating in the Accelerated Reader program. The charts in the library monitoring student progress indicate this will be another record setting year for the Edgewater Sharks!

Budget Narrative for 2013/14 The American Indian Early Childhood Education Program of Marysville

The grant funds will be spent supporting American Indian students identified by the program in kindergarten through fourth grades at Yuba Feather and Dobbins Elementary Schools.

I will offer a pull-out for third and fourth graders, twice a week, one hour per grade level, for a total of two hours for each student, sixteen hours all together per week. My travel time will be about thirty minutes each way to Dobbins and about forty-five minutes each way to Yuba Feather.

We will serve kindergarten through second grade students with three instructional assistants, three hours each. Two of these assistants will serve 51 students at Yuba Feather Elementary School, the other 26 students at Dobbins Elementary. These assistants will work in classrooms during the core instructional morning hours.

I will use a set of iPad Air tablets, iPad keyboards and a wireless printer with the students.

I will use a cassette to PC converter to convert old curriculum from a filmstrip and cassette format to digital. Most of this curricula is no longer available, but still valuable for use.

I will take the fourth graders on a three-day field trip to Point Reyes in March. We will participate in a cultural exchange with students at West Marin School and visit them the first day of the trip. We will stay at a hostel, take the Earthquake Walk, and visit tide pools, Kule Loklo Village, the Drake's Bay Oyster Farm, the Kenneth Patrick Center, the Point Reyes Lighthouse, spend an evening at Limatour Beach and barbeque dinner there, and visit Tomales Bay's Hearts Beach. Much of the instruction I plan for the third and fourth graders is in preparation for this trip.

I plan to attend the CUE (Computer Using Educators) Conference in Palm Springs where this program, and my predecessor, have gained the most up-to-date instructional training in the past. One of my goals is to continue offering our students the latest technology in instruction and innovative ways to use it.

I also need to attend the Indian Education State Conference in Santa Rosa. It is important to connect with other educators in Indian Education and the greater Native community.

As has always been done in past years, I have included indirect costs.

The parties further agree that the liability cap set forth herein shall not be applied cumulatively or on a per claim basis and nothing shall be construed so as to enlarge that aggregate limit. THE PARTIES AGREE THAT THE ABOVE TERMS REPRESENT A FAIR ALLOCATION OF RISK BETWEEN THE PARTIES

WITHOUT WHICH THEY WOULD NOT HAVE ENTERED INTO THE AGREEMENT.

7. Term and Termination

A. Term; Termination. Unless terminated earlier as provided in this Agreement, the initial term of this Agreement shall be from the date Apple signs it until the following March 31; and unless either party provides written notice of non-renewal to the other party not less than thirty (30) days before the expiration of any then-current term, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one (1) year periods. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the terms of this Agreement and any EULA, the terms of the EULA shall control solely as to the Apple Software covered by that EULA. Neither Apple nor Purchaser will be liable for any agreements, warranties, understandings, conditions, covenants, or representations not expressly set forth or referenced in this Agreement. Any different or additional, provisions in purchase orders, invoices or similar documents issued by Purchaser at any time are hereby deemed refused by Apple and such refused provisions will be unenforceable. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, no modification to this Agreement will be binding unless in writing and signed by an authorized representative of each party.
- F. Counterparts, This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts (Including by facsimile), each of which when so executed shall be deemed to be an original and shall have the same force and effect as an original but such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- G. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable for any delay or failure to meet its obligations (except for Purchaser's payment obligations) under this Agreement due to circumstances beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to war, riot, insurrection, civil commotion, epidemics, labor strikes or lockouts, shortages, factory or other labor conditions, fire, flood, earthquake or storm. Notwithstanding, this provision shall not be construed to relieve Purchaser of its obligations to make payments to Apple pursuant to this Agreement.
- H. Authority. Purchaser represents and warrants that it has all right, power and authority under applicable law to enter into and perform this Agreement and that the person signing below has the requisite legal authority to bind Purchaser to the terms of this Agreement.

- A. "Agreement" means collectively this Apple Professional Services Agreement, any exhibits, addendums, amendments or additions, and any documents or materials incorporated by
- B. "Confidential Information" means confidential Information disclosed by either party to the other, including but not limited to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, any non-public information relating to the other party's research, development, proprietary technology, product and marketing plans, finances, personnel, business opportunities, and pricing, but not including information that becomes public knowledge except to the extent made public in violation of this Agreement.
- C, "Services" means the information technology consulting services that Customer acquires from Apple, as identified in a
- D. "Statement of Work" or "SOW" means a uniquely numbered document detailing the Services that Customer will acquire from Apple, substantially in the format attached hereto as

A. Statement of Work

This Agreement shall serve as a master agreement for the acquisition of Services from Apple to Customer. It is agreed that when Services are to be performed, the parties shall prepare and execute a SOW. All Services to be performed by Apple shall be documented in a SOW. Each SOW shall set forth, at a minimum, a description of the Services, the duration of the Services, and the fees for the Services. By referencing the number and date of this Agreement, each SOW shall incorporate all terms contained herein. Apple shall have the right to accept or decline any proposed SOW.

B. Delivery and Acceptance
Apple shall make reasonable efforts to provide Services on a timely basis, subject to availability of qualified personnel and the difficulty and scope of the Services. However, Apple shall not be liable for its failure to do so, nor will it be in breach of this Agreement solely by reason of such failure. Apple may reassign and substitute personnel at anytime and may provide the same or similar Services to other customers. Services supplied by Apple under this Agreement are provided to assist Customer. Customer, not Apple, will be responsible for determining objectives. Services shall be deemed accepted, on date of delivery or upon conclusion of any agreed acceptance period stated in the SOW, if the Services substantially conform to their description.

3. Compensation

A. Fees and Expenses

In consideration of Services performed, Customer agrees to pay Apple the fees and expenses specified in the applicable SOW. If no fee is specified, Customer agrees to pay Apple's then current fee rate for each hour of Service performed. Customer may specify in each SOW an authorized limit of fees and expenses for which it shall pay for Services performed, and Apple agrees not to incur additional fees and expenses beyond the limits specified without prior written approval from Customer.

B. Invoicing

Provided Customer is eligible for Apple's credit terms; fees and expenses shall be invoiced after Services are performed on a monthly basis unless otherwise specified in the SOW. Fees due for fraction of hours shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number. Any overdue amounts shall be subject to a finance charge at the rate of 1.5% per month commencing on the date such amount becomes overdue, or the highest rate permitted by applicable law, whichever is lower. Customer will pay any tax Apple becomes obligated to pay by virtue of this Agreement exclusive of taxes based on the net income of Apple. Payment of fees and expenses shall be due thirty (30) days from date of Apple's invoice.

- Confidentiality. Any ideas, concepts, inventions, know-how, data-processing techniques, software or documentation developed by Apple personnel (alone or jointly with Customer) in connection with Services provided to Customer ("Apple Information") will be the exclusive property of Apple, except to the extent that such items are a derivative of Customer's property. Apple grants Customer a non-exclusive, royalty-free, non-transferable (without right to sublicense) license to use the software or other proprietary rights in Services developed under this Agreement. Apple may provide Customer with specific, customized or unique suggestions or information as part of the Services developed by Apple, which suggestions or Information do not have application to other customers of Apple ("Customer-Owned Information"). Apple will identify all Customer-Owned Information and furnish that Information to Customer subject to the qualifications set forth in this Agreement, and Customer will own all of Apple's right, title and Interest in the Customer-Owned Information.
- Warranty. Except as expressly represented otherwise in this Agreement, and to the extent not prohibited by law, all Services provided by or on behalf of Apple to Customer under this Agreement are furnished on an "AS-IS" basis, without warranty Agreement are furnished on an "AS-15" basis, without warranty of any kind, whether express, implied, statutory or otherwise especially as to quality, reliability, timeliness, usefulness, sufficiency and accuracy, ALL IMPLIED WARRANTIES, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ALL IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF CONDITION, MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE ARE DISCLAIMED BY APPLE, NO ORAL OR WRITTEN INFORMATION PROVIDED BY APPLE SHALL CREATE A WARRANTY UNLESS INCORPORATED INTO THIS AGREEMENT.
- 7. Limitation of Liability and Remedies. IN NO EVENT, WHETHER AS A RESULT OF BREACH OF CONTRACT, WARRANTY, TORT, STRICT LIABILITY, STATUTE OR OTHERWISE, SHALL EITHER PARTY BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL OR INDIRECT DAMAGES (INCLUDING LOST BUSINESS PROFITS, LOSS OF DATA, INTERRUPTION IN USE OR UNAVAILABILITY OF DATA) OR FOR PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES. IN THE EVENT THAT APPLE SHALL FAIL TO PROVIDE SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS AGREEMENT, APPLE'S





ENTIRE LIABILITY AND CUSTOMER'S EXCLUSIVE REMEDY SHALL BE FOR APPLE TO USE ITS REASONABLE EFFORTS TO REPERFORM THOSE SERVICES WITHIN A REASONABLE PERIOD OF TIME; PROVIDED, THAT IN THE EVENT APPLE IS UNABLE TO CORRECT ANY DEFAULT OR BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT BY IT, APPLE MAY ELECT TO REFUND ALL PAYMENTS ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY IT FROM CUSTOMER FOR THE SERVICES IN QUESTION, IN FULL SATISFACTION OF APPLE'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. THE SAID REPERFORMANCE OR REFUND SHALL CONSTITUTE APPLE'S ENTIRE LIABILITY AND CUSTOMER'S EXCLUSIVE REMEDY FOR SUCH DEFAULT OR BREACH, IN NO EVENT SHALL THE AGGREGATE LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES OF APPLE, ITS EMPLOYEES OR AGENTS, EXCEED THE AMOUNTS CUSTOMER ACTUALLY PAID TO APPLE FOR THE SERVICES AT ISSUE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. Making Conservative Multiyear Projections

The Governor's May Revision seems like it was a long time ago, and a lot has changed in the world of school finance since then. One thing that hasn't changed is the need for chief business officials and superintendents to make conservative, but credible, revenue projections for both the current year and two out years. Making those estimates is more difficult than ever and the consequences are more significant.

Under prior law, districts received changes in revenue that were relatively equal to one another, and we had a long history of how the state would fund education in both good and bad times. Today, the new system is untested and offers widely divergent revenues for districts. We see at least three varieties of risk that need to be considered in district revenue projections.

Economic Risk

First, there is a continuation of the economic risk that all districts have faced in the past. That risk is likely to be ever-present in the California economy. If we look back over the past 20 years, we would see that the average increase in school district revenues has been a little over 3% over that long period of time. The highest increase was 10.3% in 2001, and the lowest a 12% cut over 2008-09 and 2009-10. So, including past and current year cost-of-living allowances, our economy during good times and bad has generated only a little more than 3% per year in new dollars.

Today, we find ourselves with a 22.272% deficit factor for revenue limits that disappears under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), but nonetheless, is a factor in the Governor's planned targets. Based upon current economic projections, we would need to receive increases of 5% to 7% over a period of eight years in order to meet the Governor's goal. Will the economy that has provided 3% increases for 20 years really provide 5% to 7% increases for the next eight years?

Over that eight-year period, we will have four new Legislatures, at least one new Governor, a loss of \$6 billion in Proposition 30 revenues, and probably at least one or two recessions. We think that makes the economic risk high, and we think school districts need to be prepared for the next downturn as well as the next good year. Our own forecast is that state revenues look pretty solid in 2013-14 and 2014-15, but we are reserving judgment on years beyond that.

Bottom line: as much as we would like to see eight years of sunshine and happiness, we think we will see a bit of rain, and that represents risk.

Political Risk

Political risk is not limited to changes in the faces occupying state offices. There is also, in our view, considerable risk that the state will, again, shift its focus away from education and toward some other state goal. Education competes with social programs, prisons, reduction of the "wall of debt," new water initiatives, the high-speed rail, and a variety of other alternative uses of state funding.

For 2013-14, the Governor was able to channel nearly all new money into education despite a strong push-back from the Legislature. How many years in a row will he be able to do that? One? Two? Eight? Given past experience, political priorities will change from time-to-time to reflect the "issue du jour," and, over

time, there will likely be other priorities that demand the state's attention. We think that when the Governor's education plan requires such a significant portion of future revenues for such a long period, it represents additional risk.

Process and Regulation Risk

Finally, the LCFF is the biggest change in public education funding in more than 40 years. It is less than one month old and likely to be revised in many ways. We saw dramatic changes in both the Governor's and Legislature's proposals between the Governor's January Budget Proposals and the state's Enacted Budget in June. We think it is reasonable to assume that the law is not yet perfect and will likely change over time.

We also see that the task given to the State Board of Education (SBE) to sort out some of the most controversial and significant provisions of the law regarding the Local Control Accountability Plan will be difficult and time consuming. After all, the pendulum has swung widely from full local control in January, to very tight state control in May, to broad principles with the details to be decided by the SBE in the Enacted Budget. The topic of local control and the restrictions placed upon districts was not kicked to the SBE because it was easy. The SBE will need to deal with quite a number of volatile issues. Again, we believe this increases uncertainty and risk.

Multiyear Projections

Multiyear projections remain the cornerstone of financial planning and long-term solvency. When we add a dollar in ongoing revenues in the first year, we improve the three-year projection by three dollars. Overly optimistic out-year projections create pressure to spend "projected" dollars now. We want to spend today's dollars on today's students, but not more than that. We do not want to borrow from the education of tomorrow's students.

Our planning recommendations have always reflected what we believe is a safe balance between current spending and future spending. That is as true under the LCFF as under the old revenue limits system. Our multiyear revenue projections provide full value for the dollars in the hand from year one, and a lower estimated value for the dollars remaining in the bush. As we have seen recently, there are years where there are no dollars and, in fact, no bush.

The test of any projection mechanism is how it stands the test of time. Our School Services of California, Inc., (SSC) Dartboard has stood the test of time, though it has been modified many times to meet changing conditions. We believe that districts that follow the guidance in our SSC Dartboard will continue to achieve better than satisfactory results.

Our Recommendations

For the past 35 years, SSC has been providing planning guidance directly to school agencies. Our goal has been to provide guidance that is consistent, accurate, relevant, timely, and conservative. Given all the uncertainties of any new system, it is difficult to measure with precision all of the elements of risk. Nonetheless, we attempt to do so in our guidance.

We believe that point estimates lack the precision that is implied; rather, we prefer range estimates that leave room for professional judgment. The results of the guidance contained in our SSC Dartboard and the resultant calculations from our SSC Simulator are a detailed portrayal of revenues for each individual district in the state. We take into account the unduplicated student eligibility counts and the LCFF base, and supplemental and concentration grants to which the district is entitled.

To ensure that the range of our revenue estimates is conservative, we apply the LCFF calculations to two different numbers. We first give full credit for the amount appropriated in the 2013-14 Budget Act in the first year in both calculations. But in the out years, we present the Administration's calculation based upon our understanding of the total amount of growth toward target that the Department of Finance projects as a



planning factor. For 2013-14, this is displayed as the top of our range of revenue estimates. To establish the bottom of the range, we use an SSC-developed factor that is representative of the minimum amount we think the state would need to contribute in each year to at least maintain the overall purchasing power of the LCFF from one year to the next. These two calculations form the relevant range for planning.

Districts that budget according to the lower boundary have a high degree of confidence that, over the three-year period, revenues are likely to be provided as planned. Districts assume greater risk as they move from the lower boundary toward the upper boundary. For any given district, this additional risk may or may not be warranted. But the point is that there is definitely additional risk and the district should know that it is indeed assuming that risk. Your county office of education may also have an opinion about whether your district should assume that risk and what your backup plan might be.

Summary

Beyond our specific recommendations for this year, we think the overarching purpose of our methodology is to protect districts from the next "bad year" for the State Budget. We think there will be a year, or perhaps years, where the state's ability or willingness to fund education is far below the amount necessary to maintain progress toward the goal.

As stated above, state revenue projections look good for the next year or so and our model may initially produce a projection that is lower than the amount of funding actually realized in the out years. But, over time, we believe that the margin of safety provided by our planning factors will serve public education agencies well.
