


Congratulations!

Or will Furniture and Cabinet Construction do?


Photography, 3D Animation, and Graphics

Broadcasting which will not bore.


The options continue with Welding, Small Business,

in the wide open CTE learning air.




Out there things can happen

And footsy as you.


And when things start to happen

Who soar to high heights.






You won't lag behind, because you'll have the speed.

*can* happen too.


Students can get all hung up

To make these fragile students feel grand.





Our students may come to a place where choices are not marked.

Provide enhanced classroom supports and are so welcomed schools happily holler.


Categorical programs supports all sorts of folks.


Students and parents and teachers galore

LCFF is present – no doubt.




You bet, there is fun to be done!

Are just some of the donations secured to help cure their blues.




On this journey we continue to hike.
