Attorney General's 2016 Report on California's Elementary School Truancy & Absenteeism Crisis reported the following:

"Three-quarters of all chronically absent students in kindergarten and first grade did not meet the California state standards in math and English language arts in 2014-2015"

It is estimated that 9,700 kindergarten and first grade students in California were suspended in the 2015-2016 school year

Low income students account for 82% of all suspensions and 30% of all suspensions involved students receiving special education services

Foster children are suspended at a rate two and a half times that of non-foster students

Suspensions disproportionately impact boys, low-income students, foster students and students with disabilities.


Over the past six years, school districts in California have lost an estimated \$7.3 billion in funding due to student absences.

US Department of Education Findings 1996

According to recent statistics, about 50 percent of prison inmates are high school dropouts

High school dropouts are twoand-a-half times more likely to live in poverty than high school graduates and are almost twice as likely to be unemployed.

Truancy is not the problem—it's an indicator of other problems





In 2015-2016, Marysville Joint Unified School District.....

283 kindergarten students missed 3 or more days of school.

170 first grade students missed 3 or more days of school.

In Yuba County, 149 petitions were filed to remove children from homes of substantiated neglect, physical abuse or sexual abuse since July 2015

MJUSD has identified 108 students that are in foster care and attending our schools

Many of these students have had to attend multiple schools making it difficult to keep up with the required coursework

We have identified over 175 homeless students that attend MJUSD schools

This means our students live in adequate housing

Some MJUSD families live in their cars or in a tent

Some may be doubled up with another family

Many of our students don't have a bed to sleep in at night






Many of our homeless students are considered habitually truant...


