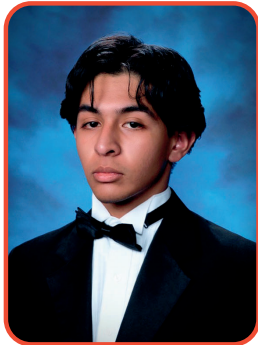

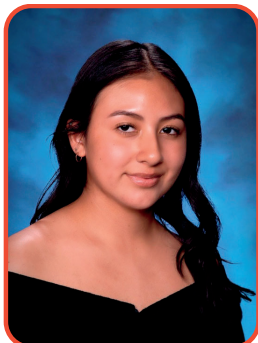


### 4. NORBERTO MONTERO-HERNANDEZ

## SEAL TEAM IMMORTALIZES SENIOR PLEDGE TO COMMUNITY SERVICE

The MJUSD Student Engagement and Leadership (SEAL) team, which was established in 2022, have taken the first of many actions to enhance student impact on the community. Senior students, class of 2023, developed and brought to the School Board an action to recognize students who have participated in community service with a seal on the high school diploma, a letter from the Superintendent, and a teal cord at the graduation ceremony. Community Service as part of a high school experience is not a new idea. College applications and many job applications ask about experiences related to community service.

This builds character and civic minded future leaders. MJUSD

did not have a formal process to recognize this until our student leaders developed a concrete plan and presented that to the School Board. With this action, they are saying that giving back to the community is important and encouraging others to do so. A committee is hard at work in developing the criteria and the process to ensure that students will readily access community service opportunities and participate to improve their community.

With organizations like SAYLove and Blue Zones seeking community support to host several projects, there are many opportunities for MJUSD students to get involved in community improvement efforts. There are other organizations that could absolutely benefit from this commitment by reaching out to us and providing this opportunity. These organizations will have to complete required paperwork before being added to the list and parents will have to sign the approval for students to participate. Either way, we will now be seeing many more of our future leaders actively engaged in efforts to make our community better.

The MJUSD College & Career department has established a process whereby students can sign up and participate in these activities throughout the year. A committee is hard at work establishing the number of hours required and the process to validate the hours. ## ENGLISH LEARNERS CELEBRATED AT ANNA MCKENNEY AND AT YUBA GARDENS RECLASSIFICATION CEREMONY ON TUESDAY, MAY 30, 2023

For the first-time, Marysville Joint Unified School District held a districtwide reclassification event to celebrate the Reclassification of our English Learners. The ceremony recognized the students who have reached a level of English mastery equivalent to native speakers.

In front of a crowd of cheering parents and proud family members, teachers and site principals, English Learners from all of our schools were celebrated, honored and recognized for attaining English proficiency on this special evening. This year, we are proud that 229 EL students were reclassified.

During the ceremony, the Director of English Learners and Student Supports (Hector Gonzalez) called each student by name to be greeted and congratulated by site Principals, Directors, Assistant Superintendent Jay Trujillo, and Superintendent Dr. Fal Asrani.

What does it take to be reclassified? To qualify for reclassification, students must meet state and district standards during an annual assessment of English language skills and development. The ELPAC is a rigorous series of exams that measure language skills through reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Those who reach a level of proficiency typically exhibited by fluent speakers are "reclassified," and no-longer required to enroll in ELD courses.

In addition to now being bilingual or tri-lingual, reclassified students will be prepared for college prep courses at the junior high and high school level.

We like to recognize the critical role teachers have in serving our English Learners. Their tireless effort has paved the way for these students to achieve this level of skill. We would also like to give a special thank you to all the EL Facilitators, principals and directors for their efforts in helping organize this event and for their participation.

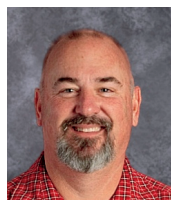

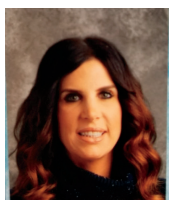

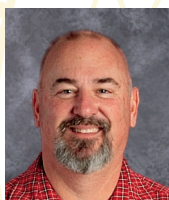
